

Increase your knowledge of industrial hygiene to help you prevent the

development of occupational disease and injury in the workplace. He will define how industrial hygiene can complement and help complete your company safety program by starting to look at how you can identify, evaluate, and control the various hazards/agents, which generally fall into chemical/physical/biological agents, as well as the primary routes of entry into the body, including respiratory, skin absorption, ingestion, injection, and eye/ear absorption. You will gain an introduction to some key anatomy/physiology aspects, some key regulatory issues, as well as some focused professional societies and certifications.
